#### Road to Kindness

Every morning when we wake up, we have some choices to make. We could choose to have a good day or a bad day. We could choose to be kind and caring, or we could choose the opposite. There are times when we are challenged due to current situations, family matters, work issues, etc. These are the times when we need to reach deep inside and think about the times in our life that brought us happiness or when someone was kind to us.

To help us, we want to look at some important areas from "The Hope Line" publication.

Do you think that choosing to be Kind each day will make you happier? The Hope Line publication says that "Showing Kindness Makes You Happier! We are not on this planet alone....and when we care for each other, our life takes on more meaning...more purpose...and quite honestly, more joy. It is probably obvious to point out that after a day of purposefully showing kindness, the people around you feel better." Additionally, the Hope Line has a section of 25 inspirational stories on random acts of kindness and how they made an impact on someone's life! When you have a challenging day, it can be refreshing to read through these inspirational stories.

Now, let's look at why we picked as our Mantra, Follow God's Way - "The Road to Kindness!"? God is Kind and he wants us to show our Kindness. The Bible often talks kind: "Be kind to one another, about being tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you." 

#### THE CENTENNIAL PROJECT



With the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord, last weekend marked the end of the Christmas season and the resumption of Ordinary Time in the Church's liturgical calendar. Ordinary time will remain in place for eight weeks until the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday.

One could say that the time we are living in is anything but ordinary. We are fast approaching two years of slogging through the pandemic. Society and daily life has been turned upside down. Businesses shuttered, schools closed, people quarantined, and marketplaces emptied. Vaccines were developed, providing hope for a brighter outcome, yet the rapid acceleration of variants is unsettling. Anxiety still stalks us at every turn.

Now, more than ever, we need to grow in our relationship with our Creator. We need to cultivate a simple faith that He is in control and that our task is to approach our life each day with our best effort, our willingness to learn and improve, and embracing all of it in the spirit of joy.

This same spirit is found in the environment that is fostered at St. Joan of Arc School. 2021 was a good year for St. Joan. We finished up our first full year in the new school and the children love it. Our enrollment grew to 484 students. Additional rooms were added. The pandemic was managed with sound protocols and the children were able to stay in class. We are grateful for our blessings.

The initiative to renovate the 3rd Floor of the new school also continues its positive trend. We want to take a moment and express our gratitude for the outpouring of support.
