On January 22, 1973, the Supreme Court decision in Roe v. Wade made abortion the law of the land. It is amazing that 49 years have passed since this decision made it legal to take the life of a child, a person, a human being, in the womb. Despite the possibility of overturning Roe v. Wade by the present Supreme Court, this by no means suggests the fight is over. If it returns to the states, the fight will continue. Sadly, as a preemptive measure, some states have already enshrined abortion as a right in their state constitutions. Some have made viability of the child within the womb as the limit for having an abortion while others, such as New Jersey and Vermont, have made it legal to take the life of a child all the way up to birth. As Pope Francis says so often, we live in a "throwaway culture" or as Saint John Paul II famously taught, we must replace a "culture of death" with a "culture of life." Changing laws is an important step in defending the life of the unborn but even more important for a true "culture of life" is to change hearts. How do we do this? First by opposing abortion in our consciences. We must believe that abortion is truly a sin, a grave evil that cannot be allowed, even in our minds and hearts. We must work toward this culture of life by proclaiming courageously that we are Pro-Life to our families, in our workplaces, and in the voting booth. This must expand to helping pregnant mothers who are struggling to decide to keep their babies, by supporting them through their pregnancies, and by caring for them after the baby is born. We can promote the culture of life by believing in the inherent dignity of every human being—even those who are adamantly opposed to our Catholic worldview and make their opposition known. We are called to heed the words we find in the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer for Masses for the dead: "Life is changed, not ended." We are human persons from the moment of our conception until the moment of our death when God calls us home. We change greatly during our lifetimes, from single-cell embryo to crying baby to maturing adolescent to full-grown adult all the way through the decline of old age. There is a continuum of life that needs to be acknowledged and affirmed. Unfortunately, so much of our broken world sees human life only in terms of efficiency, of productivity, of what you can do. That is why the fight to end abortion must continue. In keeping up the good fight, we not only save the life of one individual human soul, we save the soul of humanity!


### That Man Is You

# THE CENTENNIAL PROJECT

#### **REP News:**

As can be seen in the photos below, the conference room in the Religious Education Program (REP) offices of the new school is nearly complete. Thanks to the hard work and trade skills of our Facilities Director Matt Dunkle,





our REP will have their own formal meeting and training space. In the past they had to scramble for available space wherever it could be found at the Areba Campus. The Sand Hill conference room will provide a convenient central location for the needs of their many ministries, including outreach programs such as RCIA, Adult Education, and Faith Enrichment, as well as the planning and preparation meetings for instruction of dozens of parish children for the reception of the Sacraments (Penance, 1st Communion, and Confirmation). This room addition would not have been possible without your generous support of the Centennial Project.


St Joan's religious education resources serve adults and they serve all the children of the Parish-those who are home-schooled, those attending public school, and those attending our parochial school. With an enrollment of 484 this year, St. Joan of Arc School is the largest elementary school in the Diocese. It is a blessing to have this growth, and we are projecting over 500 students for Fall 2022, even before opening enrollment to the general public.

Here's where we need your involvement. Over the past two and a half years, the Centennial Project 2020 has raised nearly \$2.8 million in commitments (\$2.57 million in receipts) for the purchase of the new school and the Areba Social Hall renovations. In the past three months, the 3rd floor renovation project has added another \$1.35 million in fundraising, bringing the total to \$4.15 million. The original goal of the campaign was to raise \$6.4 million to finish the new school and apply any remaining funds to pay down the debt. We are striving to complete the third floor in one mobilization as it is more cost effective than approaching it in phases, but we will do whatever it takes to have adequate class space for the next school year.

We are counting on your generosity to succeed in this effort. Please continue to fulfill your pledges, and if you haven't donated yet, please consider a sacrificial gift to the Centennial Project 2020. Thank you!
