I mentioned in my past columns that Pope Francis announced has "Synod on the Synod" for 2023. This "synodal process" is a way for the Church to listen to the voices of laypeople, priests, deacons, bishops,

religious brothers and sisters to hear about new ways of evangelizing the world in today's culture. Each generation has to find ways of transmitting the eternal truths of our Catholic Faith to the world in which we live. The methods to spread the faith used in the early Church, the Middle Ages, and after the Protestant Reformation, are going to look different than how we pass it down today. The advent of modern technology, social media, and the widespread decline in the practice of the faith (at least in the West) makes it even more important to find new ways of evangelizing.

This "synodal way" is taking place on a parish, diocesan, regional (in our case, through the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, USCCB) and on a world-wide level when the synod takes place next year. I plan on having two townhall meetings to discuss the questions the diocese has provided for us as we move forward in this process. I encourage all of you to be part of this discussion. The dates for our parish-phase of the Synod will be the following:

- Tuesday, February 8 at 7 pm in the Parish Social
- Saturday, February 12 at 10 am in the Parish Social Hall

If we have lots of excitement, I can certainly have other dates and times available. Evangelization of the Good News of Jesus Christ is the responsibility of all Baptized Christians. Be part of this process. Who knows? At the "Synod on the Synod" next year we might hear the words: "We got a great idea from the good people of Saint Joan of Arc in Hershey, Pennsylvania!" To be included in this process is an honor and not something we should take lightly!





THE CENTENNIAL PROJECT

Today's readings advise us to take the long view when dealing with resistance that may confront our plans, especially the pushback of naysayers. Both Jeremiah and Luke examine the negativity of those who know us well, and the trap of indecision that can hold us back from realizing our God-given potential. In the First Reading, the



Lord instructs Jeremiah to rise above his youthful apprehension. He reminds him that "before you were born I dedicated you, a prophet to the nations I appointed you... They will fight against you but not prevail over you...

In the gospel the people of Nazareth go so far as to run their native Son out of town on a rail, foreshadowing His treatment in Jerusalem. Jesus maintains His composure and quietly slips through the crowd of hometown skeptics and travels to Capernaum where He once again performs miracles. He resumes the mission for which He was predestined.

In Paul's letter to the Corinthians, we hear the antidote to negativity. We may recognize it as the very popular "wedding" epistle (Love is patient, love is kind...) Love has no pretense. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails.

St. Joan of Arc School is an environment that nurtures love and respect for others. As a parish community we have a vested interest in the formation of our children, as it will ultimately determine the strength and resilience of our society. For ninety-five years St. Joan of Arc School has been a model of students' spiritual and intellectual development. It has been a beacon in the community. 
