



Don't forget that Monday, February 14th is Valentine's Day. This year in a special way, please consider a gift to the Centennial Campaign. Whether it's our Religious Education Program (REP), or our parochial school, our children develop the internal compass required to navigate the secular culture. If we are to safeguard the integrity of the family as the core fabric of our society, it is our solemn duty as parents to provide them with the spiritual, moral, and academic tools for their success.



Saint Joan of Arc School is a nationally recognized Blue Ribbon School with S.T.E.M. certification. The success of our new facility would not be possible without your financial support. The demand for a St. Joan's education has quickly overtaken our classroom capacity, so it is essential that we raise the funds needed to complete the third floor. It is our hope, through fervent prayer, that your pledge or gift is contemplated in the spirit of shared sacrifice. Every dollar is important and very much appreciated. If you haven't yet considered a gift, there are several creative approaches to contributions that may match your current situation:

- Stock prices have appreciated very significantly over the past few years (The Dow Jones Index has increased 75% in five years). If your nest egg permits, a gift of stock directly to charity is exempt from capital gains tax.
- A gift of all or part of a required minimum distribution (RMD) would not be considered taxable income
- Gifts of real estate are deductible at appraised value.
- In planning a budget, on-line giving enables recurring monthly debits that automatically end when the pledge is completed. Pledges over time generally result in a larger total gift.
- Use the Centennial envelope in your monthly mailer for your convenience, and your donations will be recorded.

All gifts and proceeds are deposited in a restricted savings account that can only be used for the renovations of the St. Joan of Arc School or the Parish Social Hall improvements. It is very difficult to raise enough money through cash donations alone. We also must rely on everyone that is able, to develop a personal goal of generosity and then accomplish it, whether through a one-time gift, or a pledge one step at a time.
