This week we begin the great Season of Lent. Just a few reminders:

- Ashes will be distributed at all Masses on Ash Wednesday. We will be sprinkling the blessed ashes on the top of the head rather than the forehead this year because of the Coronavirus Pandemic.
- Our collection on Ash Wednesday will once again be for our Sister Parish in Haiti. You have been so generous in the past with this collection that I know you will be even more generous this year! The money we collect on Ash Wednesday does so much good for the people of Haiti.
- Stations of the Cross will be prayed each Friday night in Lent at 7 PM. We will not have our regular "Soup and Stations" this year because of the pandemic but Deacon Joe will be doing a series on Saint Joseph during this Year of Saint Joseph. A video presentation will be available on our website each Friday during the Season of Lent. Please take time to view these reflections as part of your Lenten prayer.
- In case you have forgotten, a reminder of fasting rules for Lent from the USCCB:

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Have a good and holy Lent!


