After the Grand Jury Report was released last August, we here at Saint Joan of Arc held our own listening sessions early on to talk about our thoughts and feelings over this deep crisis in the Church. After the initial 3 listening sessions, we had a follow-up session in November to discuss some concrete actions we as a parish could do to bring healing and understanding to those who are hurting. There was a desire on the part of those involved to look at the subject of healing from a spiritual, educational and catechetical approach. As part of our parish follow-up, I am glad to announce the following activities for our parish during 2019. The whole series will be called "Toward Healing." - **†May 2** "The Church's Teaching on Human Sexuality: An Overview" (Adult Religious Education)
- †May 23—"Building Bridges Between Estranged Members in the Christian Family: A Family Therapy Perspective" led by Dr. Joseph Dreiss, PhD, clinical psychologist
- **September 12**—Saints who have Endured Sexual Abuse" Presentation and Prayer Service
- **September 26**—"Prayer as a Way Toward Healing" (Adult Religious Education)
- †October 10—Day of Fasting and Prayer for Healing of those Sexually Abused by Clergy—All day fast followed by Evening Prayer Service and Reflection
- †October 24—"Domestic Violence: A Catholic Perspective" by Susan Kelly-Dreiss, founder and former Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Coalition Against Domestic Violence
- ₱November 14—Exposition and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. Holy Hour for those who have suffered Clergy Sexual Abuse
