Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week

- The Chrism Mass will be celebrated on Monday for the priests and deacons. This Mass will not be open to the public.
- Confessions will be heard at 7 PM each night.
- ✤ There will not be Tenebrae this year.

Holy Thursday

- There will not be the Washing of the Feet this year.
- Procession with the Blessed Sacrament at the end of Mass will not include altar servers, lectors or EMHCs.
- Confessions will be heard after Mass at the doors of the sacristy (as we have been doing during the pandemic). Please speak softly and do not come behind the curtain.

Good Friday

- During the Good Friday Liturgy, the veneration of the Cross will take place but please do not kiss or touch the crucifix. A profound bow or genuflection is encouraged.
- Stations of the Cross at 7 PM will be Pro-Life Stations for the victims of abortion
