

We continue to be optimistic this week as there appears to be a path toward a "new normal." If all goes well, construction projects could resume by May 8. This is welcome news to St. Joan of Arc, since it will allow enough time to complete the renovations to the new school. As we move forward, please continue to pray for the health and wellbeing of all of our community, especially the sick and the vulnerable. Please also pray that classes start at the new facility by the end of August.

Thank you to those who continue with their pledge payments. A special thank you to those who have accelerated, and, in some cases, fulfilled their pledge. We recognize that budgets are tight, (as is ours), and we are grateful for all that is received. We will soon be entering a period of paying significant sums to the contractors for their completed work and we hope to reignite the campaign to meet our short term goal. So far we have raised about seventy-five percent of that target (\$3.4 million), and we are inviting those who are able to make a sacrificial gift.

CALLING ALL COUPLES

30-55 YEARS OLD

There is a new program we are looking to start in our parish. It's called Missionaries to the Family, and is run by Paradisus Dei in partnership with the University of Notre Dame. Missionaries to the Family is a calling to married couples to go deeper into the faith and learn to lead others into a deeper relationship with God. You will genuinely become missionaries to our world, as Pope Francis puts it, to have "a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything."

This program is a year-long online course with professors from the Notre Dame Theology Department. It consists of 52 weeks of lessons (about 1 hour of video lecture and 1 hour of classwork per week) and 3 guided retreat weekends. After the year of classes, the couples will work together to help the ministries around the parish. We are hoping to find 4 couples willing to make this commitment!
