- ♦ Lots of updates for you:
 - With all the uncertainty of when we will be able to gather again for Mass, a number of events in the parish need to be postponed:
 - ♦ First Holy Communion would have been celebrated on May 2. If we are restricted in the number of people who can come together at one time (I think it will be 25), we are coming up with some plans to possibly celebrate our children's First Holy Communion in small groups at different Masses throughout the summer. We will keep you informed.
 - Our May Crowning will have to be postponed. Maybe we can honor our Mother in Mary's "other" month, October.
 - ♦ Eighth Grade Graduation and our Pre-K and Kindergarten Promotion ceremonies will not be able to take place as scheduled. There are a lot of good ideas being circulated in the school as to how to celebrate these milestones in our parish.
 - As I mentioned in last week's bulletin, the Parish Festival will not take place in June as planned. We are hoping to have the festival in July or August but, once again, that really depends on where we are with opening the churches.
 - ♦ The Centennial Committee has decided to make some changes regarding our 100th Anniversary Year. Mass with Bishop Gainer followed by a banquet at the Hershey Lodge will take place at the END of our centennial year on August 15, 2021. We will have some kind of kick-off of our centennial sometime in the Fall of 2020.
 - Memorial Masses for those who have died during this pandemic will be celebrated at a later date. Since these will probably not be published in the newspaper, we will communicate with you via bulletin, website, and word-of -mouth when these will take place.
 - ♦ The renovations on the new school were postponed for a month but they are starting again this week. We are confident that we will be able to start school on time this year—even if we are pounding in the last nail the day before the students arrive!
- ◆ Just a word of thanks for all your patience, your understanding, and your goodness during this difficult time. Keep your parish family in your daily prayers and let us pray for the day when we can interact with one another again. Absence DOES make the heart grow fonder! God bless and stay healthy and holy!

As we enter the month of May, and prepare to celebrate Mother's Day next weekend, let us petition our Holy Mother Mary to intercede for us to restore the health of the sick and bring wisdom to those who lead the effort to end the global pandemic.

Good news! As of this writing, renovations to the new school have restarted as Governor Wolf has moved up the construction project resumption date to May 1. The schedule is tight, but we are cautiously optimistic that we will occupy the new school by the end of August. The new school has also helped to stimulate enrollment. When the 2020-2021 school year finally begins, at a minimum, 390 students will be attending classes. This is 35 more than our current enrollment of 355 or an 10% increase. St. Joan of Arc School is a nationally recognized Blue Ribbon School with STEM certification.


