Summer Mission Trip



Happy Mother's Day to all Mothers, Grandmothers, Great-Grandmothers, Godmothers, Mothers-in-Law, Stepmothers, Foster Mothers, and Mother Superiors! Here are a few pearls of wisdom to live by from our saintly Mother Teresa of Calcutta. St. Teresa taught us to focus on what is right in front of us:

- "If you want to change the world, go home and love your family."
- "Yesterday is gone. Tomorrow has not yet come. We have only today. Let us begin."
- "I don't do great things. I do small things with great love."
- "Spread love everywhere you go. Let no one ever come to you without leaving happier."

- "There is no key to happiness; the door is always open."

Not as well-known about her life was that Mother Teresa suffered what St. John of the Cross described as "the dark night of the soul." She felt as if she had been
