

Graduation season is rapidly winding down. It is a time for goodbyes and new beginnings. This week we say goodbye to Fr Roth. We thank him for his three years of dedicated service to our church and our school. We know that he will always carry St. Joan in his heart, even though he may not show it on the turf or the hardcourt when we play St. Joe's. We know he is a great competitor, but above all, he is a good priest. The church needs more young men like him.



We say hello to Fr. Joshua Weaver who comes to us from St. Catherine Laboure. We offer him our prayers and support as he settles into his new role. What an exciting time for all the graduates, whether grade school, high school, college, trade school, post graduate or professional school. Your future is bright.

All of the successes of our children depend upon a solid foundation of education and mentoring, both at home and at school. St. Joan of Arc supports the family by providing the environment for children to thrive. St. Joan needs your financial assistance

to assure its continued success in the future. We have completed the second year of our Centennial Project 2020 Fundraising Campaign and we are about half way to our goal:

- 651 families have made a contribution.
- 84% of committed funds have been received.
- We have achieved 44% of our original goal of \$6,400,000.

Enrollment at our new school is accelerating much faster than expected as our school has been a model for things done right during the pandemic. We are blessed to have generous parishioners who recognize the need for developing and modernizing our educational facilities and to make it affordable to as many as possible. For a promising future for our children, please consider a sacrificial pledge to the Centennial Project 2000. Proceeds will go to the completion of the third floor of the new school and for the improvements at the Areba Social Hall and kitchen.


