Just as a clarification, the receptionist jobs, while part-time, will be flexible in the hours being worked, that is, it does not have to be a strict "morning/afternoon" arrangement. The same is true of the Administrative Assistant position.
- Thanks to all who came out to bid farewell to Susan Robison this past Sunday as she retires as our Parish Secretary. It was a great tribute to Susan for her many years working for the parish and also of the goodness of so many of you who honored her by your presence. We are looking to memorialize a gift in honor of Susan. The tabernacle in the Saint Lucy Chapel is borrowed from the Archives of the Diocese of Harrisburg and does not technically belong to us. We are thinking of purchasing a small tabernacle in Susan's honor. 

School is out for summer and renovations are on the move again. Pictured to the right are the former Hershey Presbyterian offices which served as preschool classrooms this past year. Demolition of the offices will provide the additional space needed to create two full-size classrooms for the middle school. Classrooms are a premium as we have over 500 children currently





registered and or on waiting lists for the fall semester. This modest improvement gives us that needed space for school reopening in August.

To put it in a larger perspective, the West Areba Avenue School had 355 students enrolled in its final year of operation. At enrollment of 500,

St. Joan of Arc is now the largest elementary school in the Diocese. It is a blessing to have this growth, but looking forward, we need to plan now for the third floor for Fell 2022.

Social Hall renovations. The goal of
