

- Thank you so much to all of you who are taking seriously the precautions necessary to prevent the spread of the coronavirus. I know wearing masks at Mass and social distancing is not easy but as Christians we make these little sacrifices out of love for one another.
- As a reminder: if you are making a visit to the church during the day, please remember to wipe down the pew where you have been praying. There are disinfectant wipes at the entrances to the church for this purpose.
- A special thanks to our maintenance staff for doing such a good job in keeping our buildings clean and sanitized.
- The Centennial Committee for our parish will be selling wooden Christmas ornaments with the image of our church on it as a way to kick off our centennial year as a parish. More information will be coming next weekend. Please consider buying one to adorn your Christmas tree this year (we only have 500 ordered). They are so nice that you could display them not just at Christmas but all through the year.
- I had mentioned a few weeks ago that we were doing fairly well financially during this pandemic. One of the areas where we are falling behind is with the Diocesan Annual Campaign. Thankfully, we had applied for the Small Business Administration loan that the U.S. government was offering to cover the cost of payroll during this pandemic and received the loan. None of our employees were laid off or furloughed. Without this loan we would have had a large deficit at the end of this fiscal year. I am so grateful that our employees could be compensated during this difficult time. Of course, the teachers kept teaching, the parish staff kept in touch with the different ministries via livestreaming, Zoom meetings, and other creative ways, and our maintenance staff kept doing their jobs. Through it all we have been working all along!
- Finally, the new school on Sandhill is really coming together. The renovations are going well and we plan to open on August 24. Even with missing roughly 6 weeks of work because of the shutdown, we are back on schedule and looking forward to a great school year with (so far) 430 students registered to begin. God is good!

During these past two weeks, summer has really turned up the heat. With so many consecutive days of 90+ degrees and high humidity, we may never have fully appreciated the comfort of air conditioning until now. You have probably noticed that some of the church doors are being kept open. Outside fresh air is being introduced into the ventilation of our church in order to reduce the possible impacts of recirculating the same air in a closed space. For many of us,

it brings back memories of a time when our church was not climate controlled, but we should recognize this as a small sacrifice in the effort to curtail the spread of the virus.

If we look to our great grandparents, they lived in a time of greater uncertainty in the era of the 1918 Spanish Flu. Their perseverance under duress was a hallmark of their generation. They had just suffered through the Great War. They adjusted to the reality of the pandemic and made it through to the other side, all the while witnessing a tremendous loss of life. Less than a decade later, they would be plunged into an economic depression. They were steely and resilient when they had to be.

This was the backdrop of the psyche of the Catholic community in Hershey during the formation of the St. Joan of Arc Parish one hundred years ago. Faith was strong. Family was everything. Hard work was understood. Let us look to our heritage to forge the path forward. Our predecessors laid the foundation for the parish we have today. Today, it is our turn to shape the future of our children and our grandchildren.
