## **Respect Life**

A New Hope: Dobbs v. Jackson What Has Changed Since Roe v. Wade? (First in a 10-part series)

This fall, the Supreme Court will hear arguments in a new case, Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, which will reexamine, and possibly upend, some of the legal standards laid down in the infamous 1973 Roe v. Wade case which, together with Doe v. Bolton, legalized abortion throughout all nine months of a pregnancy.

Much has changed since Roe v. Wade was decided almost 50 years ago, important developments which will almost certainly affect the new Court's decisions. Over the next 9 weeks, the St. Joan of Arc Respect Life Ministry will highlight some of these changes – in law, in medicine, and in public awareness – that may contribute to the revision of abortion law in America.

#### **THE CENTENNIAL PROJECT**

Today's readings make several references to the people being lost sheep. In the first reading, Jeremiah condemns the shepherds who have mislead and scattered the flocks. He promises that the Lord will

appoint shepherds who will guide the sheep properly, and alludes to the coming of the Savior. In the Gospel Mark tells us that even though Jesus and his disciples had reached a point of exhaustion and



sought a place to rest, "When he disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things."

We don't have to look far in this day and age for a plethora of remedies to "man's search for meaning" in their lives. From popular books and audiotapes, to meditation, to charismatic leaders, to secular humanism, to atheism, agnosticism, and moral relativism, no matter what the culture or organized religion (or not), there is a common hunger to understand the purpose of our human existence. It has now come to the point that our modern education system believes ethical and moral subject matters, such as business ethics, need to be taught in school. There is a prevailing view that our consumer driven society has lost a handle on assuring honesty and integrity in our dealings with each other.

As Catholics, we have been taught by our parents and grandparents, both in word and by example, universal and timeless principles of "loving God, and neighbors as ourselves." These values are constructed on a foundation of natural law. They are not malleable. They do not change over time, even with some in our society efforts to rationalize "fairness and inclusion."
