Respect Life

A New Hope: Dobbs v. Jackson What Has Changed Since Roe v. Wade?

(Third in the 10-part series)

Viability. When Roe v. Wade was decided in 1973, viability-the age at which a premature baby can survive outside the womb-was understood to be at 28 weeks gestation, ⁵ the third trimester. Now almost 50 years later, with improved neonatal medical advances, infants born much earlier-at 22 to 23 weeks-have survived. ⁶

Roe utilized a trimester framework for gestational age, declaring that only in the third trimester did states have a compelling interest in protecting the life of the fetus. But as the medical definition of viability slid progressively into the second trimester, the legal definition remained stagnant. The trimester system as a marker for abortion was finally abandoned in the case of Planned Parenthood vs. Casey (1992) in favor of a viability model, itself in constant flux. Justice Sandra Day O'Connor disparaged the idea of viability as a marker when she wrote in Akron v. Akron (1983) that viability "is no less arbitrary than choosing any point before viability or any point afterward." Yet, that is the legal line of demarcation still in use today.

This week the Centennial Project highlights the renovations to our Parish Social Hall. All of the work done to date was

completed by January of 2020. The improvements included new flooring, wainscoting, and paint. Father Al was able to obtain refurbish three and exquisite paintings from St. Charles Borromeo in Philadelphia, which bring striking beauty to their new setting.



There were a few parties scheduled that were very successful, but unfortunately the parish could not take advantage of the facilities as the pandemic shut down everything in March 2020. When things began to open up earlier this year, strict capacity limits still remained in place until they were finally lifted this past Memorial Day.

The social hall is a multipurpose room. The auditorium and stage make a stunning venue for wedding receptions, birthday parties, banquets and other family celebrations.

The adjacent kitchen provides flexibility for food preparation or catering. The wall perimeter is outfitted background with LED "mood lighting" that can enhance the atmosphere of the event. Its robust sound digital system and projection make it an ideal meeting space.



The hall is also a work in progress. There are future plans to expand and modernize the kitchen, transform the ceiling and lighting, acquire more tables and chairs, and improve the storage space to facilitate smooth setup.
