Respect Life

A New Hope: Dobbs v. Jackson What Has Changed Since Roe v. Wade? (Fourth in the 10-part series)

In-Utero Treatments and Surgeries. The world's first successful open fetal surgery was performed on April 26, 1981 to unblock a preborn baby's urinary tract. Since then, new techniques have allowed fetal heart repair, corrections of spina bifida, removal of tumors in utero, and minimally invasive fetoscopic surgery.

Fetal Pain. It is broadly accepted in published medical literature that unborn babies can experience pain at 20 weeks gestation. However, in recent years, studies have shown that a pain response is exhibited by unborn babies at 10 to 12 weeks, or possibly earlier.⁸


THE CENTENNIAL PROJECT


There will always be challenges that we face in our daily lives but we must remain resilient to achieve the goals that we set. To many, the last seventeen months feel like a lifetime. Yet when we
