Historical Facts About St. Joan of Arc

In 1920, Milton Hershey gave the Bishop land for the purpose of erecting a church. The site was on Chocolate

Avenue and it was decided at the same time to change the name from St. John the Evangelist to St. Joan of Arc. On July 29, 1921, Bishop McDevitt determined the parish lines for the parish and Father Patrick Phelan was appointed first pastor.



THE CENTENNIAL PROJECT

Covid- 19 has once again reared its ugly head and transmission rates are accelerating. Mississippi is one of the worse- case scenarios where the daily number of new cases is 25% higher than last January. Pennsylvania is doing much better at 18% of last January's highs, but it still represents 1800 individuals per day. There is much to pray about as we ask God's intercession to end this surge and watch over our children as they return to class.

How quickly things can change. It was June 28th when we were celebrating the end to the mask mandate, and the indoor capacity restrictions. Here we are less than sixty days later and we are holding our breath waiting for another shoe to drop. What can we do to alleviate this daily anxiety?



It is important to recognize that anxiety is a symptom of believing that we can control all of our circumstances, when in reality that is not possible. While our best effort is certainly warranted in a situation, allowing God into our daily plans nurtures a greater sense of peace and confidence. Let Him help you. In the Gospel of John, Jesus said, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me." We are reminded that all of the well- known saints developed a daily devotion and a personal relationship with the Lord. It enabled them to accomplish the great things for which they were beatified.

In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus said to his disciples, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, Move from here to there, and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you." Is it any wonder why the early Church spread so quickly? The example and accomplishments of ordinary people in the face of adversity and even death moved hearts and minds to the call. It was the serenity and self-assurance of the faithful that was so compelling.
