Saint Joan of Arc's Eucharistic Annual Devotions, (40 Hours) begins this weekend. Exposition of Blessed Sacrament will take place after the 11:30 Mass on Sunday and after the 9:00 am Mass on Monday and Tuesday.

The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed on the altar in the monstrance all day long. All are encouraged take to



some time for personal prayer in front of Jesus in the Eucharist these next three days. At 7 pm each evening, we will have devotions with a Liturgy of the Word and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Father Tim Sahd from Seven Sorrows in Middletown will be our preacher each evening. Our Closing of 40 Hours will take place on Tuesday evening with invited priests, deacons and their wives, and religious sisters joining us. 40 Hours originated in Europe and was brought to the United States of America by Saint John Neumann, Bishop of Philadelphia (which included what is now the Diocese of Harrisburg) in the 1850s. Our diocese is one of the few dioceses in the U.S. who has continued this long tradition, with every parish celebrating 40 Hours each year. May this be a special time of grace for us as a parish and may each of us take this time to enter more deeply into our relationship with the Lord Jesus who is our "food for the journey" in the Eucharist!



THE CENTENNIAL PROJECT



For three consecutive weeks in the Gospel of Mark, Jesus uses the analogy of the treatment of children to instruct His disciples how to spread His message. He likens the faith of His new followers to the simple trust of children. Jesus also admonishes His disciples on the severe price of misleading them, comparing it to the harm or corruption of children.

"Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me." (Mark 9:37)

"Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe [in me] to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck

and he were thrown into the sea. (Mark 9: 42)

"Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these." (Mark 10:14)

Parenthood is an awesome responsibility. Children are entrusted to us to teach and to develop a love for God and a love for one another. Their formation starts in their infancy as their eyes, ears, and sense of touch assimilate and respond to the stimuli of their new environment. It's a time when they discern security and insecurity.

In early childhood they learn the concept of an environment that it is more than just about themselves. They begin to form their social skills through the teaching of their parents and through their interactions with others, both positive and negative. They depend upon their family as an anchor and the focal point of reference to the world they perceive. Parents are their first teachers and they are the preeminent judge of what is best for their children.
