Just a few updates about things happening in the parish:

- 1. John Triscik, our Youth Group Leader, is currently our Interim-Director of our Religious Education Program. He will be in this position until the end of REP. John is doing a great job and I thank him on behalf of the parish for taking on this second responsibility. I encourage all our young people to become involved with LIFETEEN (our high school youth group) and EDGE (our middle school youth group).
- 2. We closed on the house behind the convent right before Christmas and are in the process of renovating it to become the home of the Daughters of Our Lady of Mercy. The Sisters are happy with the house (how would you like to houseclean 10,000 sf?) and their new home should be ready for move-in sometime in the early spring. The Knights of Columbus have been a great help in getting the "new" convent ready for the Sisters.
- 3. We will be looking at the present convent next to see how best we can use it for parish activities, organizations and ministries. A few people have asked whether we will keep the chapel. The answer is YES. It will be great to have a small prayer and worship space for smaller groups. There are 14 rooms upstairs (with a bathroom in between each) that will make great office space and some very large rooms on the first floor and basement which will be great for the parish. Growth has its challenges but when all is said and done, it is a very good thing!







# SCRIP Fundraising Program

You can help fund St. Joan of Arc School just by using SCRIP gift cards for your everyday purchases. This is a small effort, no cost way for you to support our school.

What is SCRIP? Scrip fundraising is a no-selling program that enables people to raise money for their non-profit organization. Scrip is just another way to pay for everyday purchases using gift cards in place of cash, checks, and credit cards. Over 17,000 nonprofit organizations all over the country are taking advantage of the program. Our school has been using the SCRIP program successfully for about 15 years.

How funds are raised using Scrip. You purchase gift cards at face value, and our school coordinator orders those cards from Great Lakes Scrip Center at a reduced price. The difference is an instant rebate for our school. It's really that simple!

How to use the gift cards. For example, use the gift cards to buy your regular groceries. Treat them like cash. When you pay with your gift card, the cashier will deduct the amount from your card. If there is a balance left on your card, you keep it to be used the next time you shop. (For Pronio's, the full amount must be used because it is a paper certificate and no unused credit can be issued.) It is important to note that using your gift card **does not** affect your gas point accumulation/usage or any rewards/discounts.

Where to buy the gift cards. Grocery gift cards for Giant, Redner's, Karns, and Weis Markets (\$100 denominations) and Pronio's (\$10 certificates) will be available every Sunday in the parish office and every second Sunday of the month at the Second Sunday Social. You may also purchase these grocery gift cards at the school office during schooldays from 8am-4pm.

## You can make a difference!

The more individuals and families participating, the bigger the earnings for our school. If 100 SJA Church families purchased \$100 of Giant, Redner's, Pronio's, Karns, or Weis gift cards to do their shopping each week for a year, the school would earn \$25,000! Think of what would happen if even more parishioners participate!

#### Interested in Purchasing other Gift Cards?

You can also participate in the SCRIP program through the school to order gift cards from many major retailers. It is a great way to support our school by doing your general shopping with SCRIP. There are over 400 retailers available. Paper SCRIP orders must be placed at the school by 9am on Monday to get gift cards of Friday of that same week. For those who are technologically savvy, the SCRIP program also offers online ordering, electronic certificates and a mobile SCRIP wallet, so SCRIP can be ordered and redeemed from a smartphone by debit from a linked bank account.
