

THE CENTENNIAL PROJECT



It's hard to believe that it has been two years since we learned of the availability of Lancaster the Mennonite Hershey Campus and entered into a formal agreement. It seems like yesterday, but it also seems like years ago when considering all the time and effort invested by so many to get it up and running. At the time of its closure, the school supported fewer than 200 students. There was no kitchen. Box lunches were delivered each day. There was elevator to allow indoor accessibility to the two usable floors. St. Joan's first enrollment in the facility was fast approaching 400. An entire wing of the upper floor had to be renovated, not to mention the required infrastructure of HVAC, electric, plumbing, internet, etc. An

empty block of needed office space had to be reconfigured and finished. Amazingly, all of this was accomplished in the shadow of a pandemic, which shut down construction for three months.

Now, as we enter into our second year of education, need for additional space is already pressing in upon us. An enrollment of 400 students last year has grown to 485 this year. We've added a third kindergarten class. Most importantly, there is a recognition in our parish and the surrounding communities of the importance of a faith-based education in the formation of our children. The barrage of messaging from a secular world is confusing to navigate and enticing to the impressionable. Now, more than ever, they need a solid foundation for lifelong guidance. A Catholic education provides the environment to nurture their growth.
