As we make a push to finish the 3rd floor of the School and REP Center on Sandhill Road (and I will be asking for a generous donation!), let me remind you of some of the rental monies we have been bringing in that goes toward our yearly budget:

- For the past two years we have been renting space to The Western School for the Deaf. Originally located in our former pre-School room below the Parish Center, this wonderful school for hearing impaired children (pre-school through kindergarten) now is housed in the former parish offices in the Saint Joseph Center. They are great tenants!
- Speaking of great tenants, the Hershey Presbyterian Church rents space at our school. They use one of our former classrooms as their office and other spaces on the ground floor for Sunday worship and other activities.
- Penn State College of Medicine has been renting our field behind the rectory and the gymnasium as part of a program they are sponsoring called Indoor Exercise Partnership which supports healthy living.
- We are renting our Areba gymnasium to various traveling basketball teams and we have plans for the spring to rent fields for various sports up on Sandhill.
- We are continuing to rent out space for things like baby showers, wedding showers, birthday parties, etc., in many of the various spaces we have available now in the old school.
- While we are not asking for rent, we also have a Community Room in the old school (we need to get a better name for that!) which is offered free of charge for our local community. Right now we have Alcoholics Anonymous meeting there three times a week and we are offering the space for Guitars for Vets in the coming days. If you know of any local groups looking for space for meetings, I am glad to discuss it with them!

I also want to let you know that as we proceed to collect donations for our Centennial Project Capital Campaign, we are continuing regular repairs and maintenance of our buildings (budgeted yearly for just these kinds of things). Some things completed and some things coming up:

• We have repainted the Library, classrooms and restrooms at the Areba Avenue building. These spaces are being used for all of our parish ministries and organizations. Sorry for inconvenience these past couple of weeks in moving you around to accommodate the painters. (I heard some don't like the one color I chose! Oh well, I don't always get it right!)

- Speaking of the old school (we really need a better name for that!), we will be placing artwork and statues around to make it more of an adult space rather than one just intended for children.
- One upcoming repair will be a major inconvenience in the future but it has to be done. We have gotten bids to re-do the front steps of the church. As many of you can see, there has been a deterioration over the years (they are 60 years old this year) so a major renovation will take place in the coming months. We will make them like new and will usher us into the church for the next 60 years!

Lots going on. This is what it means to be part of a growing, thriving parish! And thank God for that!

The secret impulse out of which kindness acts is an instinct that is the noblest part of yourself. It is the most undoubted remnant of the image of God, given to us at the beginning."1


