
Young Adults (21-39)

Up until now, October's weather seems like a repeat of September with many summer like days. But as we enter November and into more indoor activities, let us keep in prayer the health of our parish, our community, and our nation. We pray that all people and our political and medical leaders remain prudent in the fight to contain the coronavirus until a safe and effective vaccine can be widely distributed.



Thank you to all for your continuing support of the Centennial Project 2020. We have received over \$2,000,000 of the \$2,619,000 raised so far. Our short term goal is to raise another \$900,000 as we enter into the planning of Phase II construction to renovate the unfinished third floor of the school. Its completion will enable specialized classrooms and a beautiful chapel to accommodate all the students. It will also set the groundwork for expanding our enrollment to meet the needs of not only the Parish, but of the wider area where parochial schools have been forced to close. Current enrollment is 396 students, an increase of 11.5% over last year. We welcome the families who have transferred from Lebanon Catholic to St. Joan of Arc. Our building's current capacity has some room to grow, but it is important to plan for the increased demand for the guiding principles of a Catholic education.

Our mission as a parish is to worship, to educate and to serve our community. Our children are our future leaders. Providing them with the opportunity to grow in faith, love, and charity is one of our prime responsibilities as members of Christ's Church. The success of

our children is the most important goal we have as parents. At St. Joan of Arc, children receive a rigorous academic education in the loving and nurturing environment of Christ-centered values.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT, On February 19, 2020 the Roman Catholic Diocese of Harrisburg ("Diocese") filed for protection under chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code").

The Bankruptcy Court has established November 13, 2020 at 11:59 p.m. (prevailing Eastern time) as the deadline to file proofs of claim against the Diocese (the "bar date").

If you have a claim against the Diocese, including, without limitation, a claim related to sexual abuse committed by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim on or before the Bar Date.

IF YOU DO NOT TIMELY FILE A PROOF OF CLAIM, YOU MAY FORFEIT YOUR RIGHT TO VOTE ON ANY PLAN OF REORGANIZATION AND TO SHARE IN ANY DISTRIBUTIONS MADE TO CREDITORS IN CONNECTION WITH THE DEBTOR'S CHAPTER 11 CASE.
