
### ADULT FAITH


Special Tax Breaks – this year only –

As part of its response to the coronavirus, Congress made temporary changes to the tax code to incentivize charitable giving in 2020. Make sure to speak with your financial advisor to find out how you can save money on taxes while benefiting St. Joan of Arc. Charitable contributions of cash are deductible up to 100% of your adjusted gross income (AGI) in 2020. Ordinarily these contributions are limited to 60% of AGI. And for 2020 only, if you do not itemize your deductions, you are allowed to reduce your taxable income by up to \$300 for cash contributions to charity.

Anxiety about our children's future remains on our minds, especially in today's uncertain environment. As parents, their education and welfare is our primary responsibility. As people of faith, we must also nurture their spiritual well-being. It is essential that we establish a moral compass for their formation. There is no substitute for the love found in the home.
