Today we begin the Season of Advent. As we all know, it is a liturgical season of great expectation, a time of waiting. I don't think most of us like waiting. This year of 2020 has been THE year of waiting. Waiting for lockdown to end. Waiting for a vaccine for the coronavirus. Waiting for everything to go back to normal. Like the Hebrew People of old, we cry out, "When, O Lord? When will you come and save your people?" And it seems as if the Lord isn't hearing us! But the reality is that God does hear us and that he knows the time and the way to answer those prayers. We have to be patient. We have to have hope! So be patient. Let this Season of Advent be a time to learn patience, to pray to accept God's will, to believe with all your heart that God is in control. His ways are simply not our ways. In the end, thank God for that!





#### FATHER BEITING A.M.C.

Our Parish Volunteers have not gone to Father Beiting Appalachian Mission Center this year, but the needs of the people in the three poorest counties in America has not changed. With coal mines shut down, there are fewer jobs and more poverty than ever before.

This summer three seminarians volunteered as summer interns at FBAMC. Two from the Harrisburg Diocese (Cole Mase from Palmyra and Andrew St. Denis from Maytown) and one seminarian from the Diocese of Lexington, (he grew up in Lexington). The three of them, along with the four full time staff members, repaired decks, built ramps and dug ditches. There is still a lot of other repair work that needs to be done, but with the Covid epidemic, these jobs will be there in the spring and fall when our Parish volunteers travel to Kentucky.

Due to the pandemic, their work was restricted to the outside jobs and a lot of these people's needs will have to be completed by those who live in these homes or will have to wait until next year. There is a great need for the cost of the work that was done this summer by the seminarians and staff to be covered. With resources stretched very thin, the volunteers from St. Joan of Arc want to help in any way we can, and that means we should help financially because we did not travel to Louisa, Kentucky this year.

Our Parish's volunteers are hoping to travel to Kentucky in the spring of 2021 and again in the fall. We will have to decide whether we are allowed to work on the homes of those we serve, or will be working on "outside" jobs next year. Either way, our Parish volunteers from St. Joan of Arc are hoping to travel to Louisa, Kentucky next year.

Our goal is to raise \$3,000 to help cover the cost of the work that the seminarians and staff did this summer and to cover their expenses that they incurred this summer. As in the past, your generosity has always been very much appreciated, not only by the work that was done, but by St. Joan of Arc volunteers who rely on your help and encouragement to continue this charitable work.

#### Would you like Your PA state tax dollars to go directly to St. Joan of Arc School?

Did you know that if you pay more than \$3500 (Line 12 of your PA income Tax Return) in PA taxes you may be eligible to receive a 90% tax credit for a contribution to the Pennsylvania State EITC scholarship fund program that helps students afford tuition at a St. Joan of Arc. Families who join the Central Pennsylvania Scholarship Fund will receive a tax credit for 90% of the amount pledged, all of which will be given to the school in the form of a donation. (For example if you owe \$3500 in PA taxes, and you make a contribution with the attached agreement to St. Joan of Arc for \$3500, 90% or \$3150 will go to St. Joan of Arc, while your PA tax liability is reduced to \$350)

Your contributions could provide assistance to our school in the following ways:

- Enable the school to offer increased financial aid to more families.
- As participation in the program is for 2 years at a time it will allow us better planning.
- By increasing our funding for financial aid this may help us to keep our tuition costs as low as possible for all students and their families.
- Once a contributor joins the program they are able to continue renewing every two years indefinitely so the
  donation could potentially become a long-term blessing to our school and its students.

# CALLED TO LIVE THE FREEDOM OF THE HOLY SPIRIT IN ADVENT ~GALATIANS 5:13-26

For you were called for freedom, brothers and sisters. But do not use this freedom as an opportunity for the flesh; rather, serve one another through love. For the whole law is fulfilled in one statement, namely, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." But if you go on biting and devouring one another, beware that you are not consumed by one another.

I say, then: live by the Spirit and you will certainly not gratify the desire of the flesh. For the flesh has desires against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; these are opposed to each other, so that you may not do what you want. But if you are guided by the Spirit, you are not under the law.

Now the works of the flesh are obvious: immorality, impurity, licentiousness, idolatry, sorcery, hatreds, rivalry, jealousy, outbursts of fury, acts of selfishness, dissensions, factions, occasions of envy, drinking bouts, orgies, and the like. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

In contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law.

Now those who belong to Christ [Jesus] have crucified their flesh with its passions and desires. If we live in the Spirit, let us also follow the Spirit. Let us not be conceited, provoking one another, envious of one another.

"The Holy Spirit teaches us to see with the eyes of Christ, to live life as Christ lived, to understand life as Christ understood it. That is why the living water, who is the Holy Spirit, quenches our life, why he tells us that we are loved by God as children, that we can love God as his children and that by his grace we can live as children of God, like Jesus. And we, do we listen to the Holy Spirit? What does the Holy Spirit tell us? He says: God loves you. He tells us this. God loves you, God likes you. Do we truly love God and others, as Jesus does? Let us allow ourselves to be guided by the Holy Spirit, let us allow him to speak to our heart and say this to us: God is love, God is waiting for us, God is Father, he loves us as a true father loves, he loves us truly and only the Holy Spirit can tell us this in our hearts. Let us hear the Holy Spirit, let us listen to the Holy Spirit and may we move forward on this path of love, mercy and forgiveness."
