FROM THE PASTOR



It was 101 years ago today (December 5, 1920), that the first Mass was celebrated in the newly-built Church of Saint Joan of Arc on 441 West Chocolate Avenue. Before the Mass, the cornerstone for the church was laid. That first Mass was celebrated on an improvised altar (the church would not be fully completed and dedicated until May 26, 1922). From a small mission named Saint John the Evangelist celebrating Mass on the stage of the Central Theater in Hershey to our beautiful celebration of Mass with Bishop Gainer for our centennial, the Catholic Church in Hershey has come together for over ten decades to be fed and nourished by the Body and Blood of Christ! Many things have changed over these past 100 years: parishioners have lived and died, pastors have been changed, buildings which housed the congregation were renovated or added onto or were closed. But the one thing that remains a constant here at Saint Joan of Arc is the gathering of the People of God to give praise and worship to God our Father, through Jesus our Lord, united by the Holy Spirit, day in and day out, week in and week out, year in and year out! The life of the Church is lived out in this particular place when children are baptized, couples are married, the faith is passed on to the next generation, and the dead are buried. The Church is made present in our Masses, in the confessional, at our festivals, in chats after Sunday Eucharist, in fundraisers and prayer groups, at youth groups and on our playgrounds, in good times and bad the Church of Jesus Christ is made present in Hershey, Pennsylvania, the "sweetest place on earth"! Through the years there have been times of laughter and tears, moments of communal joy and sorrow,

times of great activity and times of gently going through the seasons of the year and the seasons of the Church calendar. This is what a parish is made of! Men and women, disciples of Jesus Christ, sharing their lives and their faith, with one another, in good times and bad, in sickness and in health, for richer and for poorer. Similar to a good marriage, a good parish is possible only through fidelity and love and respect and forgiveness and sticking together through thick and thin. Saint Joan of Arc Church is a GOOD parish. May we remain faithful and loving to God and to one another! AD MULTOS ANNOS! To many more years!!!



THE CENTENNIAL PROJECT





Committed \$888,100

After a year's delay due to the pandemic, today we rejoice. Today we celebrate the Centennial Jubilee (+1) of St. Joan of Arc Parish. It was 101 years ago to the day, December 5, 1920, when the cornerstone was set and the first Mass was said in the unfinished church on Chocolate Avenue.

It is uncanny how the world of 1920 is similar psychologically and emotionally to the times we live in now. A deadly pandemic had just decimated the planet after an endless war had finally come to a close. Here in America, an economic boom was in the early stages as women were asserting their role in civic life. The lure of credit and consumerism was on the rise.

To help put all of this chaos of life in perspective for the many Italian immigrants who built Milton S. Hershey's idyllic

town, was the Catholic Church. Back then, the focal point for the family was the parish. Beginning with St. Lucy's Chapel in Waltonville, and later St. John the Evangelist Mission Church and then St. Joan of Arc on Chocolate Avenue, societal stability was anchored in faith, family, and work ethic. Milton Hershey recognized this and he created a town that focused on these basic needs. While his lasting legacy is most certainly the establishment of the Milton Hershey School, the construction jobs he created and his gifts to the local churches in times of economic depression were visionary. He understood the importance of work and the dignity of the individual.

Fast forward a hundred years to 2021, "man's search for meaning" is no less compelling. Amidst all the turmoil and the trappings of "the good life", an inner voice reminds us of our mortality. In the parable of the "talents", Matthew 25 recounts our obligation to leave the world a little better than we found it. For those who are able, each of us is called to do our part. Later in Matthew 25, the evangelist equates our treatment of God to our treatment of the least among us. Matthew is setting the bar pretty high. Let us pray this Advent Season to pause and examine our lives and listen quietly to what God is trying to tell us.
