

I hope you all had a very blessed and relaxing July 4th holiday weekend! Perhaps you had a cookout, watched some baseball, spent time with family and friends, or a Weaver family favorite, watched the Nathan's Hot Dog Eating Contest! Whatever you did, I hope that you enjoyed it. The reason that we celebrate, however, is to celebrate the great freedom. That word, "freedom," is one that is often misused or misunderstood in our society.

When we hear the word "freedom," we generally think "free to do whatever we want whenever we want to do it." This is not real freedom. In fact, this is what we call "license." Just as a driver's license gives you the freedom to drive, "license" means you can do whatever you want. Even though this sounds good, it is not always good because license can actually lead us to have less freedom. Think of that sin that you can't seem to shake. At some point, you freely chose to commit it and you have done so repeatedly. Now, you want to stop, but you can't. You have become so attached to that sin in such a way that you no longer have the freedom to stop it. This is what St. Paul means when he says that we have become "slaves to sin."

Instead, true freedom, as St. John Paul II said, "consists not in doing what we like, but in having the right to do what we ought." In other words, it is not doing whatever we want, but having the ability to pursue what is true. Freedom cannot be separated from the truth. To enjoy true freedom, we must conform our life to what is true, to the truths of the natural law and what God has revealed in Jesus Christ and his Church. This freedom allows us to choose to be holy, to choose to be saints. In doing so, we not only avoid sin and the attachment to evil, but we experience a real freedom and a real joy that the world cannot offer.

Experience the Vast Goodness in your life as you travel down God's Way – "The Road to Kindness!" Have a wonderful week filled with Kindness!



This week we see the drywall crew up and running right behind the completed work of the plumbers and electricians. Classrooms are taking shape and the drywall installation in the hallways is indirectly giving shape to the immense great room which will be the future chapel. Green laser lights can be seen pointing in all directions, self-leveling, and making exacting plumb lines. It's exciting to watch.

The third, and the last of the summer holidays, Labor Day, is just eight short weeks away.
