

Jerry Crawford, our Parish Manager, does a great job analyzing and summarizing our weekly collections and weekly attendance. Recently, Jerry did a comparison of both weekly collections and weekly attendance from 2018 to 2022. Our yearly collections amounted to \$1,486,078 in 2018 and dropped to \$1,382,755 in 2022. That is a roughly \$104,000 decrease. The pandemic really had an impact on our revenue.

When I looked at the weekly attendance, I got an idea of why this drop in our collections took place. We went from an average weekend attendance at Mass of 1,680 in 2018 down to an average of 1,023 in 2022. That is 657 fewer people showing up for Mass each week.

While the pandemic really affected our income, I believe the greater impact is that people stopped coming to Church. The livestreaming of Masses was, and is, a good thing. Our shut-ins and those who cannot truly make it to Mass have benefited greatly by being connected to the parish and the Mass in this way. There will be people who are not able to come to Mass. It is not ideal but an understandable reality. There are also those who are reticent about public places. Health officials have affirmed that the risk is low, but it's still a personal decision, so come back when you are comfortable. We hope it is soon. But to those who, for whatever reason, have been hesitant to resume in-person participation at Mass, my message to you is: You are missed!

We need you and want you with us. The vitality of our parish is incomplete in your absence. Oh, how I wish that everyone who is a member would come to Mass each Sunday. Not only do we give due worship to God, receive the spiritual nourishment that is the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, but we are edified by your witness to your Catholic Faith. The Catholic Church is stronger when its faithful are involved and engaged. Come back! We miss you! We aren't the same without you!

Respect Life

Countering Misinformation About Abortion First in a Series

Since the Supreme Court's overturning of Roe v. Wade last month, pro-abortion organizations and the mainstream media have been circulating a great deal of false information about abortion. It is important for Catholics to know the truth about these issues, and so we will be addressing here a different topic each week in order to clarify the facts about abortion and related subjects.

Q. Is the Morning-After Pill a contraceptive or does it cause an early abortion?

A. "The morning-after pill . . . has a predominantly 'antiimplantation' function, i.e., it prevents a possible fertilized ovum (which is a human embryo), by now in the blastocyst stage of its development (fifth to sixth day after fertilization), from being implanted in the uterine wall by a process of altering the wall itself. The final result will thus be the expulsion and loss of this embryo. Only if this pill were to be taken several days before the moment of ovulation could it sometimes act to prevent the latter (in this case it would function as a typical 'contraceptive') . . .

"It is clear, therefore, that the proven 'anti-implantation' action of the morning-after pill is really nothing other than a chemically induced abortion. It is neither intellectually consistent nor scientifically justifiable to say that we are not dealing with the same thing" (emphasis added).



The Centennial Project-Construction Progress 7/11/2022


















Dry wall installation is accelerating and organizing the third-floor design. The four classrooms on the west side are nearing completion. The teachers' lounge/ rest area on the north side is roughed in at 450 sq. ft. The chapel views from the NW and SW corners capture its immensity at 7200 sq. ft.

All of the trades are being coordinated on a very tight schedule. It gets trickier each day as the pace of drywalling is rapidly converging on the plumbing and ductwork trades. Please keep the project managers in your prayers for wisdom in anticipating and successfully navigating shifting priorities.

As far as the Centennial Project 2020 campaign funding, St. Joan's benefactors to date have provided all of the capital needed for the six-classroom expansion. With skyrocketing inflation and an ambitious goal to complete the 3rd floor by September 2023, the future success of the renovations will continue to be totally dependent on your gifts.
