
PARISH MISSION STATEMENT



That might take the form of more regular prayer, getting to confession for the first time in a while, battling harder with your "favorite" sin, reading a bit of a spiritual book or Scripture, or being more charitable to your family/friends/coworkers. None of these things may be "earth shattering," but they are a step in the right direction, and if we keep taking those small steps, we'll be surprised just how far we can go by the grace of God. Countering Misinformation About Abortion-Sixth in a Series

Q. Are Pregnancy Resource Centers "bogus clinics" that should be defunded and shut down?

A. No. Pro-abortion politicians and the media have recently launched attacks to discredit Pregnancy Resource Centers (Crisis Pregnancy Centers), claiming they lure women under false pretenses, harass and intimidate them, deliberately mislead them, and even "torture" them. A group of Democratic senators has introduced the so-called "Stop Anti-Abortion Disinformation Act," which seeks to shut down Pregnancy Resource Centers across the country. Some pro-abortion groups have even called for and carried out vandalism against these centers.

But look at the facts. According to the Charlotte Lozier Institute, Pregnancy Help Centers (PHCs) provide free or low-cost vital services to women in difficult or unexpected pregnancies, such as: pregnancy testing; ultrasounds; medical exams; prenatal care; STD testing and treatment; education on parenting, adoption, and abortion; prenatal development education; material assistance like diapers, baby clothing, car seats, and strollers; sexual risk avoidance education; post-abortion recovery support; referrals for medical care; links to community and public health resources; and sometimes access to housing where mothers can stay during pregnancy and for some months after. They do not provide or refer women for abortions.

Client satisfaction at Pregnancy Help Centers is high: 98 percent of those who have actually used their services felt it had a positive effect on them, according to a study conducted by the Wirthlin Group, and one national care network, Care Net, reported a 97 to 98 percent client satisfaction rate three years in a row.

The Charlotte Lozier Institute reports that in 2019, 2,700 PHCs across the U.S. served approximately two million people with services valued at over \$266 million, and the lives of over 177,000 babies were saved.

Pregnancy Help Centers give women information on all the choices available to them, rather than just funneling them into abortions as Planned Parenthood does. As Peggy Hartshorn, president of Heartbeat International, says, "We do all that we can to eliminate the crisis, while the abortion industry offers to eliminate the child."




