When I was in the seminary, professors would emphasize doing "primary reading." This means that we go to the source. For example, you read Saint Augustine's "Confessions," Saint Thomas Aquinas' "Summa" or the encyclicals of the Popes rather than just reading commentaries on them. People commenting on primary sources is considered "secondary sources." So often, we just read commentaries on what the Church actually says and these commentaries are often filtered through an ideological lens. This is especially true of the Church's teachings on respect for human life. Did you know that United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has made many statements about the various issues that demand a respect for human life? Sadly, very few people read them. If you go the USCCB's website (USCCB.org), you will find the Bishop's teaching on such topics as Abortion, Assisted Suicide, Euthanasia, Gun Violence, Marriage and Family, Healthcare, Racism, Human Trafficking, Immigration, Contraception, Capital Punishment and the Death Penalty, Pornography, War and Peace, The Environment, **Bioethics, Love and Sexuality** and many more! The media makes it seem that the only topic we care about is abortion. We do care about that greatly but we Catholics are not doing ourselves any good if we just take the word of others on what the Church teaches about life. Go to the source. You might be surprised at what you learn!





Bake Sale Donations can be dropped off all day Friday, November 11 or early Saturday morning on November 12.


