Pray to ask God if you are being called to a more personal, hands-on encounter with the poor and the needy. It might change your life! No, on second thought, it will!

Financial Review

Fiscal Year ended June 2022 financial results, with an almost break-even \$22,000 deficit, reflected significant and sustainable improvements from the prior two years, which were impacted by Covid-19 restrictions and financially, were dependent upon government grants from the "Payroll Protection Program" (PPP) to "balance the budget". Without the PPP support, the parish would have incurred significant deficits in 2020 and 2021.

In Fiscal 2022:

- Sunday & Holy Day Offerings and other contributions recovered, but remain below pre-pandemic levels
- Fundraising activities for the church and school achieved the highest amounts in memory
- Rentals from leases to the Presbyterian Church and Western PA School for the Deaf generated new source of income
- Our school generated \$2.6 million from tuition, summer camps, after school programs and cafeteria receipts---\$1.1 million more than 2020. These increased revenues are the result of enrollment growing from 352 students in 2020 to 479 students in 2022, along with increased participation in after-school and summer camp programs.

Operating Expenses

Operating expenses in 2022 totaled \$4.6 million--\$1 million more than in 2020—Of course, SJA has incurred interest expense on the debt to finance the school purchase. Growth in other operating expenses is directly related to the growth in school enrollment and as noted above, the school has generated the necessary income to cover the increased costs. As a result, school operations are less dependent on support from the church, than in the past.

- The parish family of St. Joan of Arc has generously supported the Centennial Campaign which has enabled the purchase and improvements of the new school as well as the parish social hall and other facilities on Areba Avenue. Routine support through the Heart of the Parish Fund, which is restricted for facility improvements also have continued at a steady pace.
- The purchase of the school was partially financed with a loan from the Diocese. At June 30, 2022, the balance of the loan is \$4,119,354.

Concluding Comments

SJA ended fiscal 2022 and began fiscal 2023 in reasonably good financial shape, that allowed the parish to move forward with the renovations to the 3rd floor of the school, which has been well communicated elsewhere.

Like most organizations, our parish is challenged to generate income sufficient to keep pace with rising expenses. To continue the Parish's financial success, we need broad based help and support to:

- Increase Sunday and Holy Day Offerings
- Obtain greater participation to get closer to the Diocese Annual Campaign assessment



Notes: The project cost was on time and budget and came in a little under \$1,500,000. A \$700,000 balance is in the capital account.

Project costs came in as expected. We had change order expenses with HVAC, but that was offset by electric savings... Now, the home stretch...Construction documents are planned to commence in mid-November to obtain bids and petition Diocesan approvals...

As our goal indicates, the Centennial Project is still in need of significant financial assistance in order to avoid any more borrowing. IDESCRIPTION OF ESSENTIAL DUTIES

Position requires a versatile, trade-skilled individual. The position is responsible for the cleaning and maintenance of our West Areba and Sand Hill facilities. 
