Advance Medical Directives: Planning for Your Future

Human life is good and to be protected. All medical decisions ought to reflect this core belief. Yet some medical and legal documents used to define a patient’s future care can be harmful. No matter how well-crafted, they can’t predict all the possible scenarios and best courses of action. In each set of circumstances, we need to judge whether a given treatment will provide real benefit to the patient, without causing harm or disproportionate burdens. The safest option is to designate a health care agent to make decisions if you become incapable of doing so. It’s best to appoint a responsible, trustworthy person who understands and shares your Catholic values, and can apply them when the need arises.

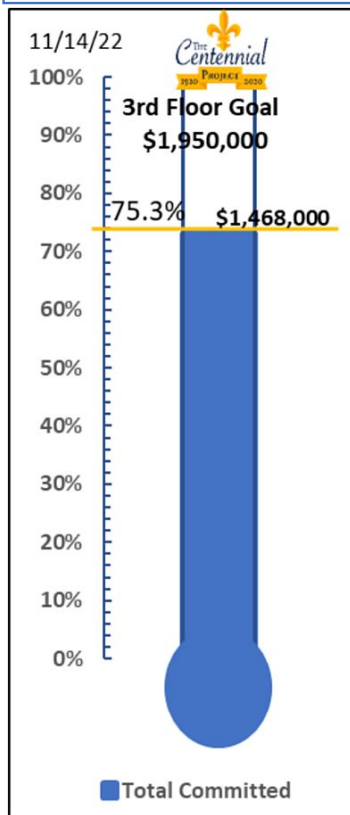
Thanksgiving is a special time for sharing. Let’s keep a thanksgiving spirit by sharing our food, and our time with family, friends and those in need.

CENTENNIAL PROJECT



As we celebrate Thanksgiving on Thursday, a fog of uneasiness has settled over our society's discourse and has imperiled our nation's structure as a Constitutional Republic. Competing visions of "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness," as penned in our Declaration, are colliding in the news of the day. Movements gather across our nation with rigid ideologies and rejection of compromise that paralyze any ability to move forward.

The truth is, however, that we have been here before. Steeped in the civil strife of the 19th century, excerpts from this well-known verse in Lincoln's Second Inaugural encapsulate the essence of the struggle in 1865:

"Both read the same Bible and pray to the same God and each invokes His aid against the other... The prayers of both could not be answered..."

Within five weeks, Lee had surrendered. Five days after that, Lincoln was assassinated. It would take another hundred years to begin to codify equality into our laws.

Family succeeds where society fails. The unconditional love of a family has no agenda. In a family there is greater appreciation for the common good and a recognition that it is a protective sanctuary for child development. There is still too much suffering and abuse in society. It would be naïve to believe otherwise. However, our solution for tackling society's problem should be a focus on strategies to strengthen families, not for more oversight and intrusion. That is why we believe in a Creator. Call it a higher power, or natural law, or faith, or religion, but the acknowledgement of something greater than ourselves is universal across 99% of

belief systems and denominations. Programs to encourage marriage, understand compatibility, and prevent divorce are all in dire need. Setting boundaries, and effective communication for couples are in high demand and facilitate longevity.

On Thursday, let us offer thanks for being able to gather together with our families, even if the cost of the dinner has risen 30%. Eat thirty percent less or eat what you have – it's the blessing of the family gathering for the meal that is important, not the menu.

Thanksgiving also reminds us again this year that we are grateful to all who have contributed to the Centennial Project:

- Thank you to those who have fulfilled their pledge.
- Thank you to those who have renewed their pledge payments.
- Thank you to those who have increased their pledges and gifts.
- Thank you for sharing your gifts of stock, your retirement funds, and your real estate.
- Thank you to those who use the monthly envelopes.
- Thank you to those who give on line.
- Thank you in advance for your generosity to the funding and completion of construction in our third year. (Summer 2023)

Your donations have enabled St. Joan of Arc to pass on the faith to future generations. Faith and conscience are vital building blocks of our democracy. The expansion is in the home stretch. There is more to accomplish, but let us first give thanks for what we have. May you and your families have a blessed Thanksgiving!
