



## CENTENNIAL PROJECT



Today is the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Advent. Where did the year go? If you have difficulty remembering, it may be indicative of the pace of life you lead. That isn't necessarily a judgement as to the ideal. It depends on your makeup and priorities.

There are those that grasp life as temporal, a gift that is to be lived to its fullest, who schedule every precious minute with boundless energy. To the observer, they seem to have the power of expanding time by virtue of all of their accomplishments.

There are those who operate at a slower pace, work hard, but stop at 5:00, and then pick up again in the morning. I often think of the Amish craftsmen who build homes

with superb skill, but go home each day on time for supper with their family. They embody the words of wisdom found in Ecclesiastes that there is a time for every purpose under heaven.

There is also the aging process which, for some reason for most of us, seems to accelerate the clock.

The Season of Advent is a time for preparation. It is a stark reminder that we can be called at any time, no matter what our station in life. We celebrate the birth of Christ and the reason for His coming. We anticipate His second coming, but it is much more likely that He will call us before Him first. We need to be ready for that meeting so we prepare. It needs to be year-round, not just four weeks in December and six weeks in early Spring. Some of the best use of time is to give yourself the time for prayer. It is a quiet time to talk to Him, to petition Him, and to listen to Him. Have a blessed Advent.

December is also tax planning time. Please remember the Centennial Fund as you appropriate funding for your charitable priorities. We have \$482,000 remaining on our goal to finish the school and the chapel. Please prayerfully consider a donation. Thank you!

## ADVENT 2022

## And the Word Became Flesh and Dwelt Among Us

In a certain sense Mary lived her Eucharistic faith even before the institution of the Eucharist, by the very fact that she offered her virginal womb for the Incarnation of God's Word. The Eucharist, while commemorating the passion and resurrection, is also in continuity with the incarnation. At the Annunciation Mary conceived the Son of God in the physical reality of his body and blood, thus anticipating within herself what to some degree happens sacramentally in every believer who receives, under the signs of bread and wine, Lord's body and blood.

As a result, there is a profound analogy between the *Fiat* which Mary said in reply to the angel, and the *Amen* which every believer says when receiving the body of the Lord. Mary was asked to believe that the One whom she conceived "through the Holy Spirit" was "the Son of God" (Lk 1:30-35). In continuity with the Virgin's faith, in the Eucharistic mystery we are asked to believe that the same Jesus Christ, Son of God and Son of Mary, becomes present in his full humanity and divinity under the signs of bread and wine.

"Blessed is she who believed" (*Lk* 1:45). Mary also anticipated, in the mystery of the incarnation, the Church's Eucharistic faith. When, at the Visitation, she bore in her womb the Word made flesh, she became in some way a "tabernacle" – the first "tabernacle" in history – in which the Son of God, still invisible to our human gaze, allowed himself



to be adored by Elizabeth, radiating his light as it were through the eyes and the voice of Mary. And is not the enraptured gaze of Mary as she contemplated the face of the newborn Christ and cradled him in her arms that unparalleled model of love which should inspire us every time we receive Eucharistic communion?


