

Last week, I gave you some statistics on where our parish ranks next to the other parishes in the diocese when it comes to finances. This week, I want to give you some stats about our parish specifically. If you recall, I mentioned that we are the 3rd largest parish in the diocese with almost 2600 families. We are an active, thriving and growing parish. Just a few stats to tell you a little more about Saint Joan's:

- Of the nearly 2600 families, we have 6,789 individuals.
- In 2022, we had:
 - * 75 Baptisms
 - * 72 First Holy Communions
 - * 79 Confirmations
 - * 23 Weddings
 - * 58 Funerals

When your baptisms exceed your funerals, you are a healthy parish. The numbers for First Holy Communions, Confirmations and Weddings are all good, although they have come down a bit over the past number of years. Regarding the age groups in our parish, here are some interesting statistics.

- 22% of our parishioners are under 21 years of age
- 27% are between the age of 21 and 40
- 34% are between the age of 40 and 60
- 17% are 60 and over

Do you realize what this means? 61% of our parish is between the ages of 21 and 60! We have a VERY young parish. Now, to be cautious, we have to admit that these are REGISTERED members. Not everyone is coming to Mass, not everyone is participating in the life of the parish, not everyone is involved, not everyone is financially supporting the parish. We need to EVANGELIZE and bring people back! More on that in the weeks to come.

2022 was a difficult year with the ongoing socioeconomic and political crisis in Haiti which brought civil unrest against the government of Haiti, armed gang violence and fuel shortages. Our pastor, Father Mario, continued construction on a new rectory in the first half of the year, but it was halted due to unsafe conditions. Sadly in the fall, we received word that Father Mario had passed away suddenly due to illness. He will be greatly missed as we keep him in our prayers.

We now have a new pastor, Father Jean Mérat, whom we are in communication with and look forward to getting to know better in 2023. He is continuing construction of the rectory and will ensure that the school children are fed and the teachers are paid.

CENTENNIAL PROJECT-FEBRUARY 5-IMPORTANT UPDATE

In a meeting held on January 24th, the Diocesan Financial Committee queried our ability to service the loan conversion of the line of credit used to purchase the Sand Hill School, with the expressed purpose of guarding against a potential economic downturn. In retrospect, if we go back to the Fall of 2020, after having just relocated from the Areba School with fifty more students, we didn't expect the demand for enrollment to rise so quickly. Suddenly, it was necessary to expand the 3rd Floor in 2022 in order to meet the two-year, 22% student body increase. Our other option at the time was to cap enrollment, which could have allowed us to take a portion of the Fund to reduce the loan principal. Given the choice, we prayerfully opted in favor of enhancing the footprint of our Catholic teaching mission.

Now, a year later, we are at a similar crossroads as far as funding and enrollment, but expenses include the additional principal required for the loan repayment. As a consequence, the Diocesan Finance Committee strongly advised that, for the near term, we only pursue the completion of the remaining classrooms, and put a pause on the chapel construction. Caution guided their recommendation to establish a substantial cash reserve, based on the prevailing opinion of many economists that a contraction was in the offing in the next year or two. Our meeting takeaway was an agreement that the timing for a stronger balance sheet was appropriate, while still finishing the space needed for the growing enrollment. With God's grace, the chapel will be back on track next year.

Here is a breakdown of our current Project Financing:


Available Cash: \$1,543,713.08

Outstanding Pledges: \$ 271,045.72

Grants: \$ 50,000.00

Project Cost Classrooms & Chapel: \$1,856,573.00

Balance: \$ 8,185.80



First and foremost, the projected revenue and expenses indicate, (excluding inflation), that if all current pledges are met, the project is fully funded. However, our cash reserves would be essentially depleted. Second, meeting our campaign goal of \$1,950,000 (see thermometer) would provide an additional \$286,000 to cover any unaccounted price increases while leaving some margin of reserves.

The incremental approach advocated by the Diocesan Finance Committee immediately reduces the initial outlay by at least \$750,000, strengthening our balance sheet in the event of leaner times. While completing the renovations of the school in one last fell swoop this summer is the desired goal, the prospect of a substantial increase in debt service tempers our zeal and informs a more conservative approach. Absent eleventh-hour white knights, (if you know of any, please tell them our story!), we will pursue the pragmatic route.
