CENTENNIAL PROJECT

After careful consideration, the General Contractor selected for the upcoming renovation project will once again be Horst Construction of Lancaster. Their experience provides important continuity as we complete the third-floor classrooms. The scope of this phase of the project is nearly a carbon copy of the work completed last summer. Barring any major "supply chain issues," we should be in good shape to begin school on September 5, 2023, the day after Labor Day. Keep the project in your prayers!

We still need \$200,000 in new gifts and pledges by the end of May to reach our 3rd floor goal. Additionally, we have a pledge balance of \$330,000 dating back to our Campaign Kickoff Event in April of 2019. Unfortunately, the Covid-19 pandemic of 2020 and 2021 put a damper on many families' ability to contribute to the campaign that continues to resonate today. Our outstanding balance remains a significant component of our overall financing plan. In the next few weeks, we will be circulating statements to update and reconcile pledges. Please prayerfully consider restarting installments if for any reason you have stopped. Completion of the final phase of the Centennial Project Renovation is very dependent on your commitments.

For those whose economic situation prevents their ability to participate, please offer your prayers for the success of the educational and spiritual mission of the school. Our society desperately needs it. For those individuals who understand and appreciate the mission but are still on the fence, remember that the goal is a shared sacrifice, so please give what you can. For those whom we have not yet reached, please share our success story in your professional and social circles. It has been our experience that benefactors with knowledge of, or even tangential affiliation with St. Joan of Arc, such as community members, parishioners, school families, and even visitors, are extremely generous and need only be asked. Thank you in advance for your advocacy!

Lastly, thank you to all who have supported the campaign with gifts, fulfilled pledges, extra gifts, major donors, and the gift of your time and encouragement. Your generosity is a blessing that allows St. Joan of Arc to be a beacon in the community.
