This week we have three important saints on the Church's liturgical calendar: Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini, Saint Albert the Great, and Saint Elizabeth of Hungary. (Actually, you can also celebrate Saint Margaret of Scotland and Saint Gertrude but this column is only so long!)

Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini (also known as Mother Cabrini) was an Italian religious sister who came to America to care for the numerous Italian immigrants who came to this country at the end of the 19th and beginning of the 20th centuries. She worked tirelessly to open schools, hospitals and orphanages. She is a reminder of the duty to care for the immigrant and the stranger.

Saint Albert the Great was a Dominican friar who perhaps was outshone by his student, Saint Thomas Aquinas, but he was a genius in his own right. This great saint reminds us to give thanks to the good and holy teachers in our lives. For those who are teachers, may your students go on to do amazing things in their lives and know that you have been part of their success!

Saint Elizabeth of Hungary was a wife and mother as well as a royal princess. Like everyone, she had moments of both joy and sorrow in her life but through it all she led a life of deep prayer, caring for the poor, and living a simple life unheard of for a woman of her station in life. She built a hospital where she personally cared for the sick. She reminds us that whatever our vocation is in life, prayer, humility and service is part of what it means to be a Christian!






