June, in the Catholic Church, is the month dedicated to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. The feast day usually falls sometime in June and thus the whole month is dedicated to it. Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus has a long history. It really begins in the Middle Ages with devotion to the human suffering of Jesus and veneration of the Wounds of Christ suffered in his Passion. There was a great mystical tradition in the Church at this time and many saints reflected intensely on the great outpouring of love Jesus offered in his suffering and death. Saints such as Francis of Assisi, Bonaventure, Gertrude, Mechtilde, John Eudes and others brought attention to the humility and compassion of Jesus in his suffering. His physical heart became a symbol of that great compassion. Of course, most of us are familiar with devotion to the Sacred Heart through the story of Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque in France during the early 17th century. This young nun had visions of Jesus in which he spoke of his great mercy and love and his promise to be with those who had devotion to his Sacred Heart. This devotion continues today in the lives of many Catholics. Look at the beautiful statue of the Sacred Heart in our church. Know that there is no sin that is greater than the mercy and love of Jesus!

Is tithing still necessary in the Catholic Church today?

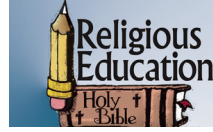

Celebrate the Feast of St. Thomas More with Bishop Gainer

The St. Thomas More Society of Central Pennsylvania will host a Mass to celebrate the feast of St. Thomas More on Wednesday, June 22, at 8:30 a.m. at St. Joan of Arc, Hershey. The Most Reverend Ronald W. Gainer, Bishop of Harrisburg, will be the principal celebrant and homilist. Following the Mass, the Society will host coffee and a light breakfast in the school cafeteria area. This will be a time to greet the Bishop, mingle with other priests, deacons, dignitaries, members of the St. Thomas More Society and parishioners of St. Joan of Arc and nearby parishes. All are welcome.

St. Thomas More (1478-1535) is the patron Saint of lawyers, statesmen, and politicians. He served King Henry VIII as diplomat and attorney until the King had him beheaded for refusing to comply with the Act of Supremacy that required English subjects to recognize the King's supremacy over the Pope. St. Thomas More was recognized in an Apostolic Letter from Pope John Paul II as "a source of inspiration for a political system which has as its supreme goal the service of the human person."

The St. Thomas More Society of Central Pennsylvania was founded for Catholic lawyers, judges and law students to promote the ideals and principles of St. Thomas More. Following is the third fact regarding Planned Parenthood issued by the USCCB:

3. Planned Parenthood provides almost 17 times more abortions than birth-oriented services. While PPFA says abortions make up 3% of its services, this is misleading. PPFA says it served 2.5 million patients (women and men) and performed 323,999 abortions, indicating that nearly 13% of everyone entering a Planned Parenthood clinic receives an abortion. And PPFA provided only 17,419 "prenatal services" and 2,024 referrals for adoptions at other agencies. So 94% of its services for pregnant women are abortions, outnumbering other options almost 17 to 1.[3]
