# God's Way - "The Road to Kindness"



On Today we want to explore the Scientific Impact of Kindness. Recent studies have indicated that Being Kind is "truly one of the most meaningful, fulfilling and life changing skills." These studies have also indicated that "when you do an act of Kindness, it shifts your mindset to live and lead a happier life." Certain psychologists have translated this into "when you are happier, you are more productive." We know that when we feel good, we want to do more!

When an act of Kindness is done, it can benefit up to three people – the person doing the act, the person receiving the act and anyone who witnesses the act. In a recent article published in the Scientific America on the "Kindness" Contagion" – "we find that people imitate not only the particulars of positive actions, but also the spirit underlying them. This implies that Kindness itself is contagious and that it can cascade across people."

The final study we want to highlight was in the Huntington Post on the "Power of Kindness." In this study, it cited that "if you perform Kindness Acts for two minutes a day for 21 days, you can retrain your brain to be more positive!" Being Kind can do wonders for your life!
