



is compromised at best, and is better taken over by others. Planned Parenthood's supporters cite its "cervical and breast cancer screenings"

[16]-- but its heavily promoted contraceptive services, over a third of all PPFA's activity, is associated with an increased risk of breast and cervical cancer. [17] Planned Parenthood's "screening" for breast cancer is a preliminary screen that a woman can do for herself - it offers no mammograms or biopsies.[18] PPFA emphasizes its testing and treatment of sexually transmitted diseases [19] – but it heavily promotes contraceptive methods that may increase women's risk of contracting STDs, including AIDS.[20] Women's comprehensive health needs are much better served by community health centers and other federally qualified health centers, which serve 22 million patients in both urban and rural areas and outnumber Planned Parenthood clinics 13 to 1 (9.170 to 700).[21].

## **Congratulations Rowan Tressler!**



We'd like to take a moment to celebrate one of our younger parishioners, Rowan Tressler, who was recently presented a pretty awesome award.

Rowan is now a second grade student at St. Joan of Arc School. His first grade teacher entered an essay he wrote into a "Cultural Traditions" essay contest from the Dauphin County Commissioners office. Rowan's essay was chosen from hundreds of submissions.

The winning essay was written around his family's tradition of the Christmas Eve Feast of the Seven Fishes, which has Catholic origin. How the tradition got started and why it's celebrated isn't exactly known. It is believed to have started when Catholics fasted to anticipate the birth of the baby Jesus on Christmas Day. They would refuse to eat until they received Holy Communion during Midnight Mass. That's when "Cena della Vigilia," or the Christmas Eve dinner, would begin. Catholics from various parts of Italy believe that meat should not be eaten on the Eve, which is why Italians indulged in what has now become known as the seafood bonanza, or more accurately, the "Feast of the Seven Fishes." It is believed by many that eating seven different types is representative of the seven sacraments.
