

The Lenten Season is the perfect time to reflect on God's love for us and to pass that love on. In our 40 Days of Lenten Kindness Program,



we have five (5) common acts of Kindness that you can do. These include: Saying a prayer for someone; Saying "The Our Father" as a class or family; Lighting a candle in church and saying a prayer for someone; Praying a decade of the Rosary; Saying a prayer for a family member. The common theme in all of these is to Pray!

You might ask, why is Praying an Act of Kindness? We call this an Intercessory Prayer, which is the form of prayer where you pray for someone else's needs instead of your own needs. This is a demonstration of your Kindness for that person, and you can intercede in prayer for one person, for your brothers and sisters, family members, groups of people, for those that are ill, etc.

Praying is so powerful! When you say a prayer for someone or for a family member, you are sending them your love and compassion. Prayers are always appreciated, even when they are said in private. Why... because God hears them! Also, as you know through our readings and in the Bible, Jesus prayed and performed many acts of Kindness. To wrap up this article, we want to share a prayer from Christian Community:

"Tender Jesus, so meek, so mild, teach us to be like You in all our ways. Teach us kindness, gentleness, generosity, and to be giving, forgiving, loving, and caring. Teach us to Pray for every person that comes across our path or enters our mind today!"



CENTENNIAL PROJECT

I'm not quite sure of its origin, but my mother often said, "a watched pot never boils," referring to our presence in the kitchen, waiting on dinner. Put another way, and perhaps taking some literary license, this old adage can be adapted for our purposes as a "watched fundraising campaign thermometer barely moves." Looking back on our "Third-floor Initiative," it began on Columbus Day, October 12, 2021 with the purpose of creating a matching pool of \$750,000. Benevolent donors quickly pledged \$700,000, and we successfully met the overall donor/ match goal of \$1,500,000 in just a little over a year.

Since that milestone in November 2022, we have been blessed with \$236,000 in additional gifts and we have made great strides toward our overall third-floor goal of \$1,950,000. The thermometer is published week-in and week-out. Sometimes there is a big jump. Sometimes it looks to be in the same place. If you follow the progress of the last seventeen months, measures of success have been both surges and increments. We were blessed with a tremendous start, and most recently, large gifts have spiked again. In between, progress was steady and consistent. We continue to rely on both of these tracks of funding to meet our goal. By any measure it has been a huge success and without you, it wouldn't be possible. Thank you for your tremendous support!

Today is the Fourth Sunday of Lent, March 19th. Ordinarily, we celebrate the Feast of St. Joseph, but it's pre-empted by Sunday Mass, so it moves to Monday, the 20th of March. Let us petition St. Joseph to intercede on our behalf for the success of our last few months of the campaign, and more importantly, in the moral development of

our children. This request is right in his wheelhouse since we know that His primary role on earth was that of guardian of Mary and Jesus. Today, moral relativism has infiltrated our modern education system and our society as a whole. Truth is subjective. Priorities are upside down. Let us pray to St. Joseph to ask Christ to blanket our children with His Mantle of Protection by guiding them in prudence and discernment.

If your budget permits, please make room for the Centennial Fund. We still need \$214,000 to complete our 3rd floor project, while the rapidly moving calendar signals the end of the campaign in May. Thank you.
